Chris Bradley's Jazz Band is a New Orleans-style jazz band. The band features well-known musicians from the entire bay area and entertains fans from all ages with real, traditional jazz. The band plays music from New Orleans, as well as music from the 1920s and 1930s. They play happy music for today's and yesterday's jazz fans.



Long-Time Favorite Festival Band Folds

The Climax Jazz Band of Toronto, Ontario, formed in 1971, and has given us half a century of great Traditional Jazz. They've been called "Canada's ambassadors of Traditional Jazz" as they performed at a myriad of festivals and clubs in North America, Europe and Japan, and on dozens of Dixieland Jazz Cruises.

Now, from Toronto, Ontario by way of the Dixieland Jazz Mailing List comes news that the Climax Jazz Band has ceased operation. Jack Vincken, banjo player with the Climax Jazz Band, writes that "...Chris Daniels (bass) passed away on January 2, 2023, [so] the Climax Jazz Band does not exist anymore. Jamie Aug (drums) and I are the last ones still playing here and there." He adds that the other longtime members of the band Mick Lewis (clarinet) and Len Gosling (trombone) are no longer playing, due to health.

"So we have joined the other bands that have recently kicked the bucket. For all of you who are still playing, keep up the good work and keep this beautiful music going for all to enjoy. Keep jazzin'!"

Change is indeed inevitable. The South Bay Traditional Jazz Society is dedicated to the performance, promotion preservation and of Traditional Jazz. Our aim is to do just what Jack Vincken is asking to do, by keeping this music alive and vital. Musicians, like all of us, grow older, but we can take heart in the fact that there always seems to be a stream of younger players who discover this music, fall in love with it, and keep it alive. They are the ones who preserve the music we love while breathing new life into it. SBTJS aims to be a part of this process, and in coming months and years you'll see both older, established bands and new, younger bands on the stage at our monthly Jazz & Dance Parties.
